

## DAY 1 - Go

**“GO THEREFORE AND MAKE DISCIPLES of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, TEACHING THEM TO OBSERVE ALL THAT I COMMANDED YOU; and surely I am with you always, even to the end of the age” (MATTHEW 28:19-20).**

Think back to when you got your first cell phone. (If you haven't yet, imagine the day you will.) Once you got the phone out of the box and turned it on, what was the first thing you did? My guess is that you shared the good news with someone. You either called or texted a friend to let them know about your latest gadget and gave them your number.

Our normal response when we receive something great is to show it to others. We want everyone to know about it because we are proud and excited. So why should our faith in God and our gift of salvation be any different? Jesus' last words to his disciples were about just that. He commanded the disciples to share the message that he had been teaching them—not only by telling others the truth, but also by living it out. Sharing your faith requires both words and actions.

This week we are going to examine what it means to share our faith with others. Did you know that the Great Commission in Matthew 28 is not the first time Jesus commanded the disciples to go? In Matthew 10, he gave them more detailed instructions with some guidelines on how to do it.

**Let's take a deeper look into Jesus' instructions in Matthew 10 using the OPA method. See how he commanded the disciples to “go” and how it applies to you.**

Read Matthew 10:1-20

## PRINCIPLES

Draw a few principles from the observations you made. WHAT IS GOD TRYING TO TEACH YOU IN THIS PASSAGE?

## APPLICATION

HOW WILL YOU APPLY THESE PRINCIPLES TO YOUR LIFE? Be specific —a good application will tell who, what, and when.
